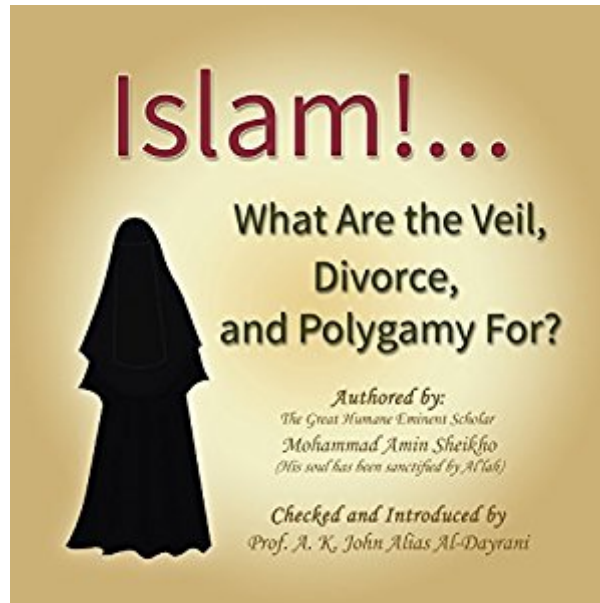

I downloaded this book out of curiosity as to how a supposedly erudite Muslim scholar from almost 2 centuries ago spoke of the contentious issues of Islam concerning women such as the veil, polygamy and divorce. The book is short and I read it in a little over an hour; it is a disappointment. The politically incorrect and self-righteous writing may appeal to like-minded Muslims who by the way are plenty in number, but it will not fly with any westerner-orientalist or otherwise. The author seems to view women from the perspective of a teenaged boy. Companionship does not seem to figure high on his list of benefits in a marital bond. His logic of the prophet's polygamy is not convincing either, and he states that the prophet (saw) married 3 Jewish women. How could a wife of the prophet (saw) reject his message? Safiya and Jaweria were formerly Jewish but they

accepted Islam, and Rayhanah was a slave who declined the prophet's proposal.
